Top DJs add new vibes to Radio Bahrain show

Meanwhile, co-host DJ Mojay has been working with Radio Bahrain since 2002 and as an avid sports fan also acts as sports anchor and news reporter for Channel 55.

Both hosts previously featured on the drivetime show from 3pm to 6pm and Imran was also on the evening show twice a week.

Imran said he just loved entertaining people whether on the radio or on stage, adding that he intends to carry on with his stand-up alongside his appearances over the airwaves.

"There are many things I love about being on the radio," he said.

"The fact that my voice is heard in three countries is awesome, as is the fact that you can change a person's mood and energy just by playing their favourite song.

"I simply love entertaining people."
